

Patient Instructions

Urine Cytology

Your health care provider has requested a urine specimen. In order to produce a meaningful laboratory test result, follow these instructions exactly.

Collection

- 1. Do not collect the first urine produced in the morning (first void). The preferred specimen is the next urine specimen produced that day (second void).
- 2. Collect a midstream urine specimen from the second void:
 - Begin urinating into the toilet. Without stopping the flow of urine, place the container in the urine stream to collect some urine. Remove the container before the urine stops flowing
- 3. Fill the container about ½ full (approximately 50 mL). Close the container tightly.

Labelling

1. <u>Label the container with your name, date of birth, and the date of collection.</u>

Packaging

- 1. Place the container in the bag provided and securely close the bag
- 2. Fold any paperwork and place in the external pocket of the specimen transport bag. This ensures the specimen will not leak onto the paperwork.

Storage and Transport

- 1. Specimens require fixative to be added immediately after collection. If the specimen cannot be collected at the lab:
 - Refrigerate and bring the specimen to the lab within 2 hours from the time of collection.

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
